MINE HORROR AT COALDALE.

Iwenty-one Miners Entombed Thought to Be Dead.

BLUEFIELDS, W. Va., Jan. 5 .-Twenty-one miners in the Coaldale company's shaft at Coaldale, W. Va., were probably instantly killed by an explosion that has taken place there. There were three white men and eighteen colored men entombed, and no hope is held out that any of them escaped death.

The explosion was of terrific force and caused intense excitement through out the surrounding country, many people believing an earthquake had oc curred. The fans, mining cars and most of the property used in the mines

One body had been taken out, and it s believed that every man in the mine met instant death. The rescue work is slow, and full details of the disaster are not yet obtainable. The telegraph facilities at Coaldale are limited, and the wire is crowded.

The body of one of the miners has been discovered some hundred feet away from the mine entry so mutilated that he is unrecognizable. All hope of recovering alive the entombed miners has been shattered by the pouring forth of gases from the different entries. If the twenty-one men were not all killed instantly by the explosion it is believed that they must have succumbed to the great accumulation of gas following the explosion.
