KREH IS HELD TO AWAIT REQUISITION

Waverly Man Who Forged His Brother's Name to Check Will be Returned to New York State

Athens—The hearing of Albert Kreh charged with forgery and passing a counterfeit check took place before Justice Johnson at city hall at 3 o'clock yesterday afternoon. Miss Alice Hair, clerk in T. S. Walker & Son's store, was sworn and identified the man as the one who passed the check in payment of a small bill and received the balance in money, and also identified the check as the one passed upon her. Chief Brooks also identified him as the one who had fled from New York state after committing the crime, and also that the warrant had been placed in his hands for his arrest by Chas. O. Hoagland, justice of the peace of Waverly. When Justice Johnson asked if he had anything to say he merely requested the privilege of examining the check, which was granted. The verdict was then given that he should stand committed in the Bradford county jail without bail until the requisition papers could be obtained to take him to New York state for trial. It now appears that he forged his brother's name to the check. Several years ago he and his brother received a sum of money from the old country, which was divided between them. He spent his share very quickly, but his brother has taken care of his portion and is an honest, reliable citizen. Prisoner has worked in the concrete works, but been idle lately.
