While Making a Test, Copper Vessel Exploded and Plumbers Took to Their Heels

curred in Sayre on Monday evening, but as there were no fatalities the facts in connection with the accident have just come to the sur

reading. On Monday night, just after the shades of darkness had settled about the earth, four young men employed in a certain plumbing shop in Sayre, were engaged in 205 Desmond Street, attempting to find a leak in a small copper vessel. The leak was not visible to the eye and therefore a simple measure was resorted to in order to ascertain its exact location. The vessel was partly filled with water and then placed on a gas heater. When the water came to a boiling point it was hoped that dry steam would escape from the invisible hole and then the plumbers would have no difficulty in making the necessary repairs.
