BOOK CANVASSER ARRESTED AT TOWANDA

Man Wanted in Connection With Alleged Fraud Case is Taken in Custody.

S. McA. Ford, a respectable appearing, well dressed, white haired man, who gave his age as 56 years, is under arrest at Towanda, on a warrant sworn out before Justice Meredith by Arthur P. Watson of Towanda. Ford is charged with fraud in connection with the sale of a book entitled "The Congressional Manual." Some time ago a man giving his name as H. M. Johnson canvassed throughout Bradford county and sold copies of the book for \$2.50 each, claiming that the book had been endorsed by Congressmen Lilley and Deemer. It was claimed that the money was to be sent to the Memorial University at Mason City, Ia., but when the matter was called to the attention of Mr. Lilley that gentleman pronounced the book a fraud and said that he had not endorsed it. Ford when arrested claimed that he had been sent out by Johnson to collect the money for the book, and that he had supposed that its sale was a strictly legitimate transaction. Ford employed David E. Kaufman to represent him and later sent for Attorney Keeler of Rochester. Yesterday a writ of habeas corpus was secured and it will be argued tomorrow morning before Judge Fanning.
