ORRIN C. KLOCK'S SUDDEN DEATH

He Had Not Been Feeling Well But His Condition Caused No Apprehension Among His Friends

Waverly—Further details concerning the sudden death of Orrin C. Klock, which occurred yesterday afternoon, and a brief mention of which was made in these columns, are to the effect that he had not been feeling well for the past two or three days, but had been about his duties and no serious results were anticipated.

Shortly before noon yesterday he complained of being ill. Dr. Tonner, who was his partner, did what he could for him and Dr. J. T. Tucker was summoned, but he died about 1 o'clock despite the efforts of the physicians.

Mr. Klock came to Waverly from Oswego in 1902, and started to practice and teach osteopathy, but later he moved to Elmira where he continued his practice. He returned to Waverly about two months ago, purchased a home on Fulton street, and had just fitted up a fine suite of offices on Waverly street. He is survived by his wife, a daughter, Laura, and a son George, who reside in Binghamton. His father, Peter Klock, lives in Charlotte, Mich., a brother Willard Klock, and a sister, Mrs. Elizabeth Roberts, reside at Brier Hill, N. Y.

Deceased was 55 years old and was born in St. Lawrence county, N. Y. He was a member of the Media Temple of Shriners of Watertown, N. Y., and of Lansing Commandery No. 25, Knight Templar of Lansing, Mich.

The funeral will be held Wednesday afternoon at 3 o'clock from his late home on Fulton street. On Thursday the remains will be taken to Gloversville on Erie train No. 2.
