The Tioga House Damaged to the Extent of Several Thousand Dollars Last Night

Waverly-Fire broke out in the Tioga hotel at 8:45 last night. The firemen quickly responded to the alarm and three streams were soon playing on the flames. The fire was a hard one to get at as most of the flames were between the walls and between the ceilings of the fourth floor and the roof.

The fire started at the bottom of an air shaft, which was of brick on one side and lath on the other, and followed the shaft to the roof, and when the fire company arrived it was thought that the whole roof was in flames.

The Tiogas attached their hose to the hydrant at the corner of Elizabeth and Fulton streets and 10 carried it to the top of the building and from this coign of vantage, by means of a trap door in the 25 roof, the flames were soon under 25 control at this point. .

In the meantime the flames had spread under the roof and holes had to be chopped through the 56 roof to get at them. The Spaldings had a stream playing throu h a hole chopped in the ceiling of 10 one of the rooms and about 10 o'clock the fire was practically 92 drowned out. One line of hose was left stretched from the hydrant to the roof all night and four members of the Cayutas stayed on duty in case of emergency.
