STORER'S REGALL

Ex-Ambassador Says President Cabled Him to Resign His Post.

VIENNA, March 80. - The retiring American ambassador to Austria-Hungary, Bellamy Storer, returned here from Egypt. In an interview on the subject of his recall he said:

"My resignation was requested on March 6 in a telegram from the president and was sent in March 7. I have not seen what the newspapers have been saying, as I have been ill and have not been allowed to receive newspapers or letters. I am not going to cosume charge of the embassy. Mr. Rives will remain as charge d'affaires." Mr. Storer when informed of the gist of the reports in circulation concerning the reasons for his recall declined to comment upon them or to say anything about the grounds for his recall or Mrs. Storer's alleged actions in church mat-


