WOMAN WANTS \$5,000 DAMAGES

Sues Village of Waverly for that Amount on Account of Injuries Sustained

Waverly—Sophia Nelson of Pine street has filed a claim against the village of Waverly for alleged injuries received by a fall on the Dry Brook bridge in Chemung street last October.

She alleges that a plank gave way with her weight upon it causing her to fall and receive injuries to her spine which brought on paralysis to her limbs which prevented her from doing her work. Also that she is not well at present and does not think she ever will be on account of such injuries. She alleges that her fall was caused by no carelessness of her own, but by the negligence of the officials of the village of Waverly in that the plank had been in an unsound condition for some time and should have been replaced. Her husband also presents claims for \$5,000 for the loss of the services of his wife.

VILLAGE TRUSTEES MET LAST NIGHT

Waverly—At the first regular meeting of the board of trustees of the village last evening considerable business was transacted.

The president and clerk were instructed to make the necessary arrangements with the Citizens' bank to obtain funds for the current bills until taxes are collected.

The bill of H. A. Ross for \$25 for taking the recent census was ordered paid. The bond of Street Commissioner Jefferson for \$1,000, and Treasurer Whitley for \$25,000 were accepted. A motion by Farley, was adopted providing that such streets or portion of streets as shall be hereafter designated shall be sprinkled during the coming summer and the expense assessed pro rata against property owners benefited. It was estimated the cost of the above would amount to one dollar on \$1,000 valuation.

Trustee Farley was authorized to purchase two sprinkling carts and to make contracts for necessary teams and water.

Two resolutions offered by Mr. Lang were adopted, one instructing the chief of the fire department to request the Bell telephone company to make a connection with the central of the Valley telephone company in order that those who have Valley 'phones can send in an alarm of fire. The other instruction, the chief of police to remove all advertising signs from the poles throughout the village.

A motion by Mr. Farley to appoint the janitors of the different school buildings as special police was adopted and P. W. Towner was appointed care taker of the town clock at a salary of \$36 per year. Fire Chief Tucker was authorized to purchase rubber coats, lanterns and spanners needed by the department.
