FRED EMERSON BROOKS

Athens—The entertainment given by Fred Emerson Brooks at high school hall last evening was of absorbing interest to the large audience in attendance. Prof. Rogers, in introducing him, said that the pleasure of listening to a poem was greatly enhanced if it were recited by the author, and in the entertainment tonight we not only have these conditions, but better still, that the author was born here, and many of his poems were inspired by the early history of the Susquehanna valley. Mr. Brooks gave many pleasing reminiscences of his early associations in this vicinity which were presented in his attractive manner and given in language whose very simplicity made the story more than eloquent. His early home on the border of the New York state line, and his grandfather's domiciles, one on each side, made him a native of both states. The past outlined by the intervening years, leave traces of remembrance which come forth like gems to freshen and sweeten life. So Mr. Brooks spoke of his grandfather, Alexander Brooks, and Luther Stone, whose individuality had written their impress on the heart, and they were living still, although the snows of many winters covered their graves. Mr. Brooks poems are such as touch the heart with its most tender paths. We shall not forget his rendering of "Pickett's Charge at Gettysburg" or the sweet strains of "Old Age." These poems will live long after their author passes away, and they will make the heart better from this memory.
