Laux, the well known Lehigh Valley engineer, died at her home on North Elmer avenue, last night, at 6:30 o'clock, after an illness of two years' duration of Brights disease. For the past eight months' her con dition had been serious, but it was not considered critical until a few hours previous to her death.

The deceased was born in Pittston September 27, 1857, and her maiden name was Mary Hess. She was married to Jacob Laux April 25, 1875, and with her husband came to Sayre 27 years ago. For twenty years they resided on North Lehigh avenue, but for the past seven years have lived on North Elmer avenue.
