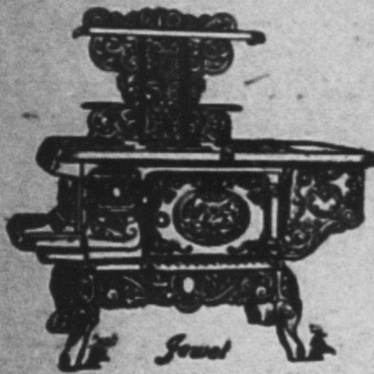

THE VALLEY RECORD
FURNISHES THE NEWS

It Does Not Have a "Special Representative" at Every Corner of the Globe, But It Gets the News When It Is Fresh

The story in yesterday's Record of the appalling disaster which occurred in San Francisco yesterday morning, when the city was practically ruined, was so far as the salient features were concerned, equal to the accounts published in the city dailies. Except so far as the loss of life is concerned, and which the telegraphic dispatches this morning show has been materially decreased, The Record's story of the disaster was remarkably accurate as to the statement of facts. The Record was not fortunate enough to have a special representative in San Francisco, so that it did not receive a "special" communication, but the story was written in our own office, the facts therefore being kindly furnished by Gilbert C. Higgins, proprietor of the Waverly stock exchange. The Record can be relied upon to furnish the important news of the day with accuracy.

It does not have a "special correspondent" in every nook and corner of the globe who is "johnny on the spot" at the critical time, but it is in a position to obtain the facts when an important matter, such as yesterday's disaster, occurs. It has been the custom in this neck of the woods for local newspapers to take garbled street rumors, work them up into a story and then palm the story off on the unsuspecting reader as a "special to the Daily Bazaar" or whatever paper it happens to be. This practice causes the intelligent reader to smile, but the average reader is deceived and appears happy in the deception. The Record, however, does not believe in hoodwinking the public in this manner. We are here to publish the news for what it is worth if we know what it is.

ANXIETY FELT HERE

Considerable anxiety is felt in Sayre among those who have friends and relatives in California, and particularly in San Francisco, which was visited by an awful calamity. W. S. Wright, the well known Elmer avenue grocer, has several relatives in the unfortunate city, and there are also several others whose relatives reside in that place. Whether any of these have been injured is not known at the present time, as the wires running into San Francisco are all down and detailed information is not obtainable.

LITTERING THE STREETS

MAN MURDERED

Shot Down at Montour Falls on Sunday Evening Last.

Fred Dickerson, a former Lehigh Valley ticket agent, who was employed by the company at Ithaca, was murdered at Montour Falls on Sunday evening. Fred Scobey is under arrest charged with the murder. The murder of Dickerson is surrounded in mystery. On Sunday evening a man and woman were out driving near Montour Falls. The woman's husband approached the carriage and fired five shots into the buggy but none of them took effect. Later in the evening the same man met Dickerson on the street and fired at him with a revolver. The shot wounded Dickerson so badly that he died shortly afterward. The man then proceeded to pound Dickerson with the butt of the weapon. The man who did the shooting proved to be Scobey and it is said that Dickerson is the man who was out driving with the woman.

CONTRACT FOR TOWN
HALL PLANS AWARDED

Council Will Probably Hold a Special Meeting to Dispose of This Matter and the Sewer Question

The town hall committee of the borough council has awarded the contract for making plans and specifications for a proposed new building to Pierce & Bickford, the Elmira architects. The architects will present plans with and without fire proof construction and it is expected that they will be completed without delay.

The council will probably hold a special meeting some evening next week to take up the report of the sewer committee who recently visited Harrisburg and presented the plans to the state department of health. The department has recommended that the east side, Milltown and the northern part of the borough should be included in the plans which have already been prepared, and the council will probably take action upon this question at the special meeting. If the council decides to include the districts mentioned the survey will immediately follow under the direction of Engineer N. F. Walker and will be presented to the department at Harrisburg as soon thereafter as practical.
