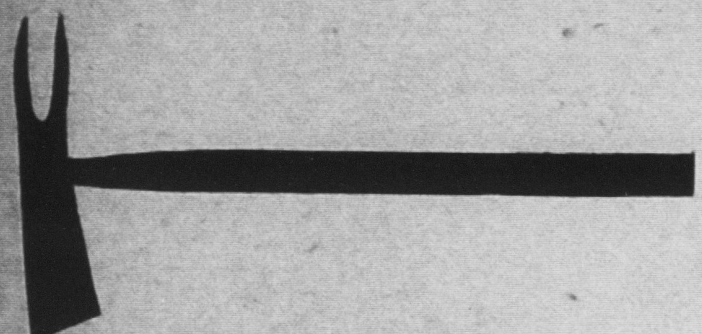

FIREWOOD THIEVES WERE RESPONSIBLE

Collapse of Grand Stand Yesterday Due to Braces Having Been Cut Away by Unknown Persons

The collapse of the grand stand at yesterday's ball game is said to have been due to the fact that the braces which were attached to the supports underneath the seats had been cut away by unknown persons who used them for fire wood. The cutting away of the braces greatly weakened the supports and when the crowd got into the seats the supports were unable to stand the weight. The grand stand is now practically a wreck and it is not likely that it will be rebuilt as interest in the great national game in Sayre is not sufficient to warrant the expenditure of the necessary money. From present appearances there will be no regularly organized ball club in Sayre this year, hence there are not likely to be any games.

LAWYER-DRUGGIST COMBINATION WINS

Disciples of Blackstone and Prescription Artists Wallop Teeth-Pullers and Pill-Peddlers

The game of base ball played on the Riverside grounds yesterday afternoon resulted in a glorious victory for the disciples of Blackstone and the compounders of drugs. Burgess Cross umpired strikes and Ike Samuels took care of the field. The decisions of the latter was a feature of the game and were of such a nature that he barely escaped being shot and his remains placed in a conspicuous place as a warning to all future umpires who showed a disposition to follow his example.
