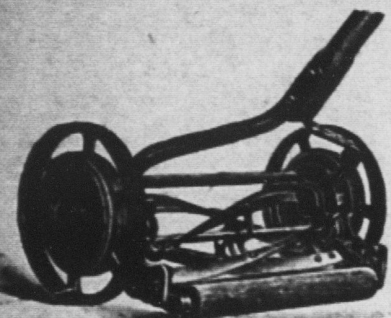

AUDITORS RECEIVE HASSLER'S LETTER

Copy of Communication in which He Requests that a Detailed Statement of Receipts and Expenditures Shall be Made

Yesterday's Record told of the action to be taken by Councilman Coleman Hassler in calling the attention of the board of auditors to the laws of 1874 concerning the manner in which the board shall make a report provided they are called upon to do by a citizen of the borough. Mr. Coleman is acting in the capacity of a citizen and the following is a copy of the letter which has been received by each member of the board:

"Sayre, Pa., May 10, 1906
Before making your audit of Sayre borough council, Sayre borough street commissioner, and Sayre borough school board, for the year ending the first Monday in June next, I wish to call your attention to an Act or part of an Act dated April 24, 1874, Sec. 2, Penna.'s Laws, Page 112, entitled "Duties of Auditors." Will you please comply with the provisions of said act? In making this audit, as a citizen, demand an itemized statement (in detail) of each and separate vouchers; to whom, for what purpose, and the amount paid, giving list of all exonerations, name of person, location and amount of each exonerations. By giving this request proper attention you can avoid considerable annoyance and expense.

Coleman Hassler."

Whether the auditors will comply with Mr. Hassler's request is not known, as they refuse to say anything concerning the matter, except that the audit so far as the borough affairs are concerned has been made for this year, and therefore do not believe that there is any power that will compel them to make a report until the stated time for next year.

On the other hand Mr. Hassler says that he has been advised by reliable and first class legal counsel that the board is compelled to make a complete and detailed statement at any time they are so requested by a citizen of the borough. The outcome of the matter will be awaited with much interest.

SLOW PROGRESS IN MURDER CASE

Confession of Accused Was Offered in Evidence Just Before Adjournment Last Night

Progress in the Johnson murder case was slow yesterday, nearly all the forenoon being consumed in allowing the jury to visit the scene of the crime. In the afternoon several witnesses for the prosecution were sworn, and just before adjournment last night the alleged confession made by Charles to Officer Guy Hollon in the presence of several others, was offered in evidence. Mr. McPherson, of counsel for the defense, objected to the admission of the confession on the ground that it did not admit any connection with the crime by which the defendant could be convicted under the indictment. In the confession the defendant only admits firing the building after the killing was done.

LAY SENTENCED TO THIRTY DAYS

Must Also Pay \$10 Fine and Costs of Prosecution for Assaulting Sayre Officer

Herbert D. Lay, the man who assaulted Officer Robert D. Groff, when the latter was placing him under arrest here some days ago, yesterday pleaded guilty before Fanning to aggravated assault and battery and was sentenced to pay a fine of \$10, pay the costs of prosecution, and undergo imprisonment in the county jail for a term of 30 days, sentence to commence May 1. Lay is the man who after his arrest broke out of the borough lockup and was later arrested at the Lehigh Valley station by Constable Brougham.

JURYMEN VISITED SCENE OF CRIME

After They Had Been Furnished Suitable Clothing by the Court Officials.

Yesterday forenoon the jury in the Johnson murder case visited the scene of the crime near Macedonia. Overcoats, mufflers, mittens, scarfs, heavy underwear and undervests were secured for the members of the jury, who had left their homes believing that the weather would eventually grow warmer, and therefore they were not clad in winter clothing. Some came to court without vests, none of them had overcoats, and the majority had laid aside their winter flannels. Judge Fanning ordered that they be furnished with suitable clothing to make the trip, and after the jail and county officials had been interviewed, enough articles of clothing were secured so that they made the trip in comparative comfort.

At a meeting of the Odd Fellows held last night, the initiatory degree was conferred upon two candidates and preliminary arrangements were made for the memorial exercises which are to occur on Sunday, June 3.

M. H. Sawtelle, cashier of the National Bank of Sayre, today received a receipt from Mrs. A. J. Cassatt, secretary of the Pennsylvania branch of the Red Cross society for \$211.58, which had been forwarded to her for the San Francisco sufferers.

There is considerable rejoicing among the railroad men over the outcome of the coal strike. Already the coal carrying lines are making preparations for increased traffic which will mean more work for train crews, and in fact more work in all departments.

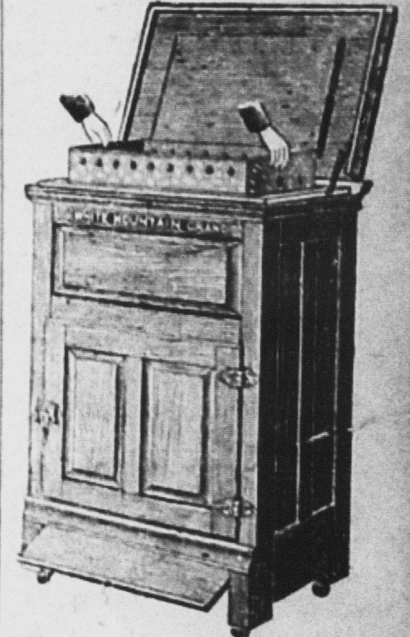
