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PRESIDENT ACCUSED Roosevelt Charged With Inconsistency by Tillman. CODE OF HONOR SHOULD BIND ALL MEN Says Executive Asked Chandler to See Mr. Bailey and Himself Regarding Rate Bill - Was Guilty of Bad Faith.

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ON A RAMPAGE OF CRIME. Telegraph Operator Ran Amuck at Chambers, Ga.

ATLANTA, Ga., May 16 - Crazed by drink and by disappointment in a love affair, James H. Clark, a telegraph operator at the little town of Chambers, a dozen miles north of Atlanta, broke out in a rampage of crime and in less than twenty-four hours killed one man, severely wounded three others, slightly wounded a fifth and clubbed a sixth with a shotgun, set fire to the home of one of his victims and when surrounded by a posse shortly after noon shot himself through the heart.
