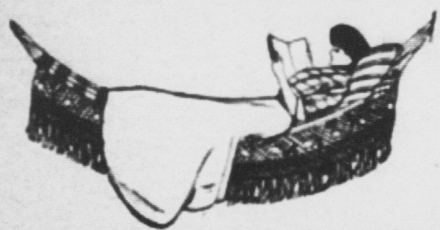

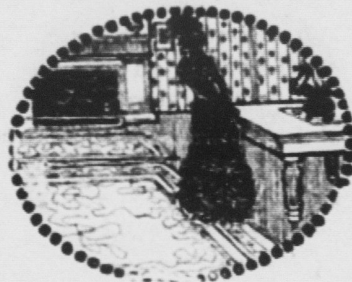

Athletics in China. The other day China had its first great athletic meeting, with 3,000 students, from 47 schools, competed in various kinds of races and sports at Canton. In a booth on the ground was a hospital corps composed of 17 young Chinese doctors, each with the Geneva cross on his arms. So strenuous were the competitors that there were many cases to attend to.
