YOUNG TWOMBLEY DROWNED.

Only Son of New York Capitalist Overcome by Cramps.

ASHLAND, N. H., July 6. H. M. K. Twombley, Jr., eighteen years old and the only son of H. M. K. Twombley, the well known New York capitalist, was drowned while swimming in Big Squam lake at Holderness, N. H.

Young Twombley came to New Hampshire about three weeks ago with a number of others who had charge of a dozen or more boys in humble circumstances who were sent into camp at the expense of the Grotton school of Grotton, Mass., from which Twombley was graduated last month.

Last night Twombley started to swim from the Grotton school camp to Carn's cove, one mile distant. He had reached a point a short distance from the shore where the camp is located when he was apparently seized with cramps.

He was seen to struggle in the water by several of the other boys at the camp, but before any of them could reach him he disappeared from view. The body was recovered within a short time after the accident and will be taken to Newport.

Twombley was very popular with the boys at Grotton and those at camp. Since his stay at the lake he had entered the water frequently and was a good swimmer. He intended to enter Harvard next fall.

Twombley's mother was Miss Florence A. Vanderbilt, daughter of the late William H. Vanderbilt of New York.

UNCLE SAM AS PEACEMAKER.

Guatemala and Salvador Making Overtures For Arbitration.

WASHINGTON, July 6.—Again the United States will probably figure as a peacemaker. Guatemala and Salvador are making overtures for the arbitration of their troubles resulting from the alleged activity of Salvador in support of the revolutionary movement against President Cabrera of Guatemala, and it is likely that the United States will be selected as the country in which the board of arbitration will meet.

The state department has been advised of the desire of the two countries which are almost at the point of making war against each other, to have their differences settled by arbitration, and, although formal negotiations have not been made as yet, there seems to be but little doubt that an amicable settlement of the points of difference will be finally effected through arbitration.

At the first intimation of outside interference in Guatemalan affairs the state department sent the Marblehead from Panama to prevent meddling and Mexico and the United States both made it clear that they would look with disfavor upon any combination of Central American powers to overthrow President Cabrera of Guatemala.

New York Garbage on Jersey Coast.

TRENTON, N. J., July 5.—Dr. Henry Mitchell, secretary of the state board of health, reported to Governor Stokes that he had been assured by the street cleaning department of New York city that every effort would be made to prevent the pollution of the New Jersey coast by New York garbage. Deputy Gibson said that if necessary New York would cease her garbage to be taken farther out to sea so be dumped. This dumping is temporarily necessary because of the destruction by fire of a steamer for the reduction of the garbage.

Waverly—Louis Erhardt, an old and respected resident of Waverly, died very suddenly yesterday afternoon at her home on Charles street. He was 75 years of age and had resided in this vicinity for the past 40 years. He is survived by one son, Henry, and one daughter, who resides at Barton. The funeral will be held tomorrow afternoon at 2 o'clock from his late home. The service will be conducted by the Rev. G. A. Briggs, and the remains will be buried at Forest home.

Ordinance No. 94.

Authorizing the construction of a public sewer beginning at the west bank of the Susquehanna river about eight hundred feet south of Hayden street, thence westerly on Hayden street to Desmond street, thence northwesterly on Desmond street to Lehigh avenue; thence northwesterly on Lehigh avenue to Cayuga street; thence westerly on Cayuga street to Stearnson street, in the Borough of Sayre, Penna. Be it ordained by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Sayre, and it is hereby ordained by the authority of the same: That believing it to be for the general health and public welfare of the citizens of said borough, that a system of public sewers be adopted and the same is hereby adopted for said borough. Beginning at a point at the west bank of the Susquehanna river about eight hundred feet south of the Sayre Water Company's pumping station and extending in a westerly direction over the lands of the Consolidated Real Estate Company and lands of the Lehigh Valley Railroad Company to Lehigh avenue to Hayden street; thence westerly on Hayden street to Desmond street; thence northwesterly on Desmond street to Lehigh avenue; thence northwesterly on Lehigh avenue to Cayuga street; thence westerly on Cayuga street to Stearnson street, all in the Borough of Sayre, State of Pennsylvania, in accordance with an Act of the General Assembly of Pennsylvania, approved May 15th, 1889, entitled "An Act to enable Boroughs to construct sewerage systems, assess and collect the cost thereof," and to carry thereof be paid by general taxation, by an assessment levied upon all the property subject to taxation in said borough. Said sewer to be constructed in accordance with the plans and specifications made by Williams & Whittman, Inc., dated Sep. 1, 1905, and approved by the said Borough Council so far as it relates to a sanitary sewer only. The foregoing Ordinance was unanimously adopted by the Sayre Borough Council at a meeting held Monday evening, July 2, 1906.

Ordinance No. 95.

An ordinance authorizing the increase of the indebtedness of the Borough of Sayre, Pa., by the sum of twenty thousand dollars. Be it ordained by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Sayre, Pa., and it is hereby ordained by the authority of the same: That two hundred and fifty bonds of one hundred dollars each, bearing interest at the rate of four per cent per annum, interest payable semi-annually, April 1st and October 1st, at the office of the treasurer of said borough and payable thirty years from date, with the right of said borough to redeem or pay any one or any number of them after five years be issued. That the proceeds derived from the sale of said bonds be used for the purpose of redeeming or paying off five thousand dollars of the present indebtedness of said borough and so much of the balance as may be necessary, shall be used for the purpose of constructing the trunk line of a sewer for the sewer system of said borough. That a tax of one mill on the dollar of the adjusted valuation of said borough be levied each year for the payment of said indebtedness until same is paid. The foregoing ordinance was unanimously adopted by the Sayre Borough Council at a meeting held Monday, July 2, 1906.
