VILLAGE TRUSTEES HOLD MEETING

Settle Nelson Claim, Fix Collector's Bond, Authorize Appeal in Water Case, and Take Steps to Reopen West End of Broad Street

Waverly—The board of trustees held a regular adjourned meeting last evening. All members were present except Trustees Myers and Lang.

The matter of the claim of Mrs. Sophia Nelson against the village for damages caused by her falling through the Dry Brook bridge on Chemung street was taken up. Mrs. Nelson and her husband had agreed to release all claims against the village upon the payment of \$500 and the doctor bill to date, which amounted to \$54. A resolution was offered by Trustee Howard, and adopted, that an order be drawn in favor of Sophia A. Nelson and William B. Nelson, her husband, for \$554 in full settlement of any and all claims for damages against the village of Waverly, by both or either of them.

A resolution was passed authorizing the village attorney to appeal from the judgment entered in the county clerk's office, arising out of the decree of the special term in the matter of the condemnation of the water works.

The question of reopening the west end of Broad street was discussed at some length. That end of the street was closed at the time the iron bridge was placed across the Erie tracks, and the Erie railroad cut away the crossing at that point, either underground or overhead, and the street committee was directed to investigate and report the most feasible plan of obtaining it.

The street committee was also authorized to purchase necessary material for the building of walks where the parties owning property have failed to construct them as ordered.

Adjourned to meet next Friday evening.

ORDINANCE NO. 23.

Authorizing a contract to be entered into on the part of the Borough of South Waverly, County of Bradford and State of Pennsylvania, with the Waverly Electric Light and Power Company of the Borough of Waverly, County of Tioga and State of New York, and authorizing and empowering the Borough to sign the necessary contract on the part of the Borough of South Waverly.

Section 1. That the Borough of South Waverly enter into a contract with the Waverly Electric Light and Power Company for and during the term of five years from the first day of April, 1906, for 6 Amp. or 1200 nominal candle power lamps, at the price of \$55 per annum. Said lights to be kept lighted every night until one o'clock a. m., and 32 incandescence lamps to be lighted every night until one o'clock a. m., at \$20 per annum for each and every light.

Section 2. The Burgess of the Borough of South Waverly, County of Tioga and State of New York, be and he is hereby authorized and empowered to sign the necessary contract with the said Waverly Electric Light and Power Company for the period of five years, dating from April 1, 1906, as soon as this ordinance becomes effective.

The foregoing ordinance was duly passed at a regular meeting of the Borough Council of the Borough of South Waverly, Pa., June 5, 1906.

ORDINANCE NO. 94.

Authorizing the construction of a public sewer beginning at the west bank of the Susquehanna river about eight square feet south of Sayre Water Company's pumping station, and extending westerly over the lands of the Consolidated Real Estate Company and the lands of the Lehigh Valley Railroad Company to Lehigh avenue, thence northerly on Lehigh avenue to Hayden street; thence westerly on Hayden street to Desmond street; thence northerly on Desmond street to Lehigh avenue, thence northwesterly on Lehigh avenue to Stevenson street, in the Borough of Sayre, Penn'a.

Be it ordained by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Sayre, and it is hereby ordained by the authority of the same, That believing it to be for the general health and public welfare of the citizens of said borough, that a system of public sewers be adopted and the same is hereby adopted for said borough, beginning at a point at the west bank of the Susquehanna river about eight hundred feet south of the Sayre Water Company's pumping station and extending in a westerly direction over the lands of the Consolidated Real Estate Company and lands of the Lehigh Valley Railroad Company to Lehigh avenue; thence northerly on Lehigh avenue to Hayden street; thence westerly on Hayden street to Desmond street; thence northerly on Desmond street to Lehigh avenue; thence northwesterly on Lehigh avenue to Cayuga street; thence westerly on Cayuga street to Stevenson street, all in the Borough of Sayre, State of Pennsylvania, in accordance with an Act of the General Assembly of Pennsylvania, approved May 15th, 1889, entitled "An Act to enable Boroughs to construct sewer systems, assess and collect the cost thereof; and the cost thereof to be paid by general taxation, by an assessment levied upon all the property subject to taxation in said borough. Said sewer to be constructed in accordance with the plans and specifications made by William S. Whittman, Inc., dated Sept. 1, 1905, and approved by the said Borough Council so far as it relates to a sanitary sewer only.
