MAJESTIC GREENSBORO SPEECH

Recent Prosecution of Trust Not Result of New Laws—Old Statutes Ample Sufficient if They Had Been Enforced.

NEW YORK, July 12.—Former Judge Alton B. Parker in a statement made public today...

Judge Parker declares that the secretary in his speech sought to have the public draw the inference...

Judge Parker in his statement says: "The inference that the secretary would have the public draw from his utterances in these things are due to new statutes...

"Not one of the successful prosecutions for which the existing administration is now entitled to credit is based on any new statute...

"Secretary Taft's speech," says Judge Parker's statement, "was interesting throughout, but it cannot be said that it was accurate throughout..."

"I said in the letter of acceptance under the title of 'Trust Remedies'..."

"I pointed out in my earlier response the remedy which in my judgment, can effectively be applied against monopolies, and the assurance was given that if existing laws, including both statute and common law, proved inadequate, contrary to my expectations, I favor such further legislation...

"The administration has now discovered not only that there is enforceable law against the giving of rebates and law adequate to check illegal combinations, but that the persons engaged in violation can be punished for it..."

DID NOT HIRE JETT

Ex-Judge Hargis on Trial For His Life.

TAKES STAND IN HIS OWN DEFENSE

Prisoner Reflected Severely on Character of Prosecuting Attorney Adams—Was Not in Plot to Murder Marcum.

BEATTYVILLE, Ky., July 13.—Former Judge James Hargis, charged with the murder of Attorney James B. Marcum, was the principal witness in the case of the state versus Hargis and Callahan...

Hargis, who was the first witness for the defense, told the story of his life in Beattytown county and how he had risen from a poor boy to a man of wealth and position. He described his whereabouts when Marcum was shot. He saw Tom White coming out of the door of the courthouse just before the shots were fired...

Witness said he had no intimation that Marcum was to be killed and said he had never spoken to Curtis Jett or any other man with reference to the killing of Marcum or any other person. He said Moses Feltner never received any money from him not to testify against him...

Hargis said the statement of Asbury Spicer was absolutely false. In fact, witness said, no conversation ever occurred between him and others with reference to Marcum...

Hargis referred to commonwealth witnesses as hooters and men who lurked around town, and it was necessary for the court to admonish Hargis on several occasions and instruct the jury not to consider such testimony...

Hargis reflected several times on the character of Attorney Adams, and Judge Dorsey sent the jury from the room while Adams took the defendant sharply to task. Attorney Young, for the defense, objected to this, but the court ruled that Hargis had made a serious reflection against the commonwealth's attorney and the court believed Adams should be permitted to defend himself...

Hargis was questioned by Attorney Byrd on cross examination. He said he had no ill feeling against Marcum as a result of the contested election cases, but he said they never spoke after the indictment for criminal libel was returned against Marcum. He did not secure an indictment against Feltner because he did not feel that Feltner could slander any one...

MITCHELL SHOT BY HIS SISTER

Youth Who Killed a "Holy Roller" Prophet Himself a Victim. SEATTLE, Wash., July 13.—George Mitchell, a youth who recently shot and killed Franz Edmund Creffield, a "Holy Roller" prophet, and was acquitted of the charge of murder on a plea of insanity, was shot and killed by his sister Esther Mitchell in the Seattle Union station...

Esther Mitchell joined the "Holy Rollers" sect at Corvallis, Ore., and was one of the most ardent of Creffield's followers. When her brother pursued the leader of the "Holy Rollers" to Seattle and shot him in the street he pleaded in justification that Creffield had deluded and wronged his sister...

George Mitchell was acquitted of the charge of murder on Tuesday last, and nearly all of the following day he spent in searching for Esther in Seattle lodging houses. She refused to be comforted after the death of Creffield...

GRIEF CAUSED SUICIDE

NEW YORK, July 13.—On the arrival here of the British tramp steamer Jacob Bright from Bahia, Brazil, it was announced that Captain Anderson of the steamer committed suicide while the vessel lay at anchor in the harbor of Rio Janeiro. The body was buried in the English cemetery. Captain Anderson's mind was supposed to be temporarily unbalanced, brought on by grief over the recent death of his wife in England...

SEVEN GIRLS DROWNED WHILE WADING

CEDAR RAPIDS, Ia., July 13.—Seven girls were drowned in Cedar river while wading. Four of them were daughters of Robert Sweeting. The smallest child slipped into a deep hole, and in trying to rescue her the six others were drowned...
