## PROPOSE TO EXTEND BROAD STREET EAST

Intended to Improve Property East of Waverly—Several Firms Looking for Locations

Waverly—An effort is being made to extend Broad street east across Shepard's creek and over the Lehigh tracks to the Rhoads farm at Ellistown. It is stated that several large concerns are looking this way for a place to locate plants; that the Pillsbury flour company wishes to build a mill and storehouse here, and that a bridge-building firm is looking for a location.

Frank Blazinski, who had let the contract for a house, which, if built, would stand in the proposed street extension, has been approached by Village President, O. H. Lawrence, F. E. Hawkes, and Hon. Byram L. Winters, whom he states submitted a proposition to buy the property to be used for street purposes. 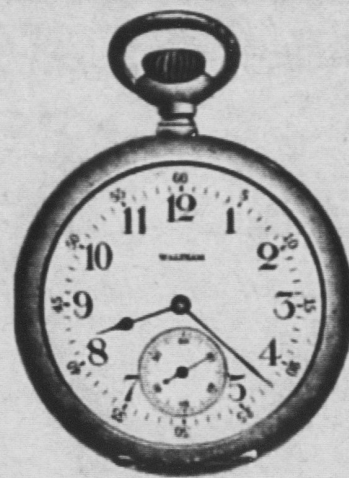
### ULSTER WON BALL GAME

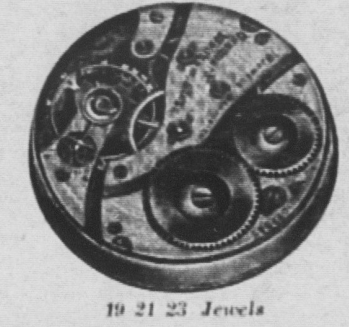

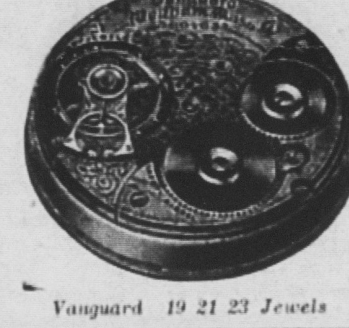

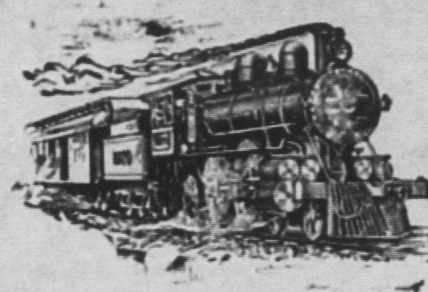
