TO FIGHT SAGE WILL

Nephew of Late Financier to Contest Estate Settlement.

TROY, N. Y., Aug. 1.—James H. Sage, a nephew of the late Russell Sage, is authority for the statement that the will of the deceased millionaire will be contested.

"I have made up my mind to get that to which, as a blood relative of Russell Sage, I am entitled, and if I don't get it it will be because there is no legal way of doing so.

with that clause of the will which directs that in case of contest the party concerned shall forfeit his or her bequest. Such a course would be illegal, and there is no desire on the part of any of the heirs to gain anything by trickery.

"I am of the opinion that during Russell Sage's last few years there was undue influence brought to bear upon him, which caused him to leave the bulk of his fortune to his wife. If Russell had left any children and the money had been bequeathed to them none of the heirs would have even thought of getting more than the \$25,000, but as it is I for one shall make an attempt to get what I ought to have, and I don't intend to be beaten out of it either.

That Mrs. Russell Sage has \$10,000, 000 at her command now and that she will distribute it to charity in the near future, as soon as Miss Helen Gould, her friend and co-worker in many benevolent enterprises, returns from Europe, was announced by a friend of Mrs. Sage.
