OFF TO STUDY APES

New York Woman Will Live In African Jungle.

STEEL CAGE TO BE HOME FOR MONTHS

In Co-operation With Professor Garner She Expects to Learn Much About Monkeys, Their Ways and Their Talk.

NEW YORK, Aug. 10.—The most remarkable adventure which a woman ever planned has been undertaken by Miss Ida Vera Simonton, sister-in-law of Morris D. Goulden, son of Congressman Joseph A. Goulden of the Bronx. She will sail next week for Africa, where she will isolate herself in the heart of the jungle to learn the language and habits of the ape and monkey tribes. This announcement was made by Dr. Fred Blair, surgeon of the zoo in the Bronx park, and Acting Director Mitchell.

Miss Simonton will be joined in the dark continent by Professor H. L. Garner, the scientist, whose investigations of simian life have won worldwide fame. Together the enthusiastic miss and the veteran scientist will ascend the Congo river until they penetrate the home of the tallies apes and the highest monkeys.

Each will have erected a steel cage large enough for a habitat and strong enough for protection against wild beasts of all kinds. They will live for several months, caged alike from harm and civilization. While the apes and monkeys disport themselves in the surrounding trees the two watchers for knowledge will strive to open social relations with them and learn their language.

Both Mr. Mitchell and Dr. Blair believed Miss Simonton would be able to throw new light on simian life and language by her stay in the jungle. They said she had some excellent theories which ought to be verified by direct observation.

Professor Garner, who is to be Miss Simonton's collaborator in this project, spent more than four months in a jungle cage in 1903. During this time he learned to interpret the languages of several species of monkey and apes, so that he could carry on conversations with them about food, enemies and similar topics within the purview of animal consciousness.

Garner found that in some of the interior savage villages the chimpanzees associated with the natives on almost equal terms, sat on their benches, ate with them in their houses and, stranger than all, actually had some words in common with the natives.

Ordinance No. 96.

Authorizing the construction of a public sewer beginning at the west bank of the Susquehanna river about eight hundred feet south of Sayre Water Company's pumping station, and extending over the lands of the Consolidated Real Estate Company and the lands of the Lehigh Valley Railroad Company to Lehigh avenue; thence northerly on Lehigh avenue to Hayden street; thence westerly on Hayden street to Desmond street; thence northerly on Desmond street to Lehigh avenue; thence westerly on Lehigh avenue to Cayuga street; thence westerly on Cayuga street to Wilbur avenue, and the Borough of Sayre, Penna.

Sec. 1. Be it ordained by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Sayre, and it is hereby ordained by the authority of the same: That believing it to be for the general health and public welfare of the citizens of said borough, that a system of public sewers be adopted and the same is hereby adopted for said borough. Beginning at a point at the west bank of the Susquehanna river about eight hundred feet south of the Sayre Water Company's pumping station, and extending in a westerly direction over the lands of the Consolidated Real Estate Company and lands of the Lehigh Valley Railroad Company to Lehigh avenue; thence northerly on Lehigh avenue to Hayden street; thence westerly on Hayden street to Desmond street; thence northerly on Desmond street to Lehigh avenue; thence northerly on Lehigh avenue to Cayuga street; thence westerly on Cayuga street to Wilbur avenue, all in the Borough of Sayre, State of Pennsylvania, in accordance with an Act of the General Assembly of Pennsylvania, approved May 15th, 1880, entitled "An Act to enable Boroughs to construct sewer systems, assess and collect the cost thereof; and the cost thereof be paid by general taxation, by an assessment levied upon all the property subject to taxation in said borough, and the same to be collected in accordance with the plans and specifications made by Williams & Whitman, Inc., dated Sep. 1, 1905, as to size of pipe, depths of trenches and grade. But to be so arranged as to take the surface drainage until such time as a Disposal Plant for the disposal of the sewerage may be required.

Sec. 2. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

The foregoing Ordinance was unanimously adopted by the Sayre Borough Council at a meeting held Monday evening, August 6, 1906.

Ordinance No. 97

An ordinance authorizing the increase of the indebtedness of the Borough of Sayre, Pa., by the sum of twenty thousand dollars.

Sec. 1. Be it ordained by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Sayre, Pa., and it is hereby ordained by the authority of the same: That twenty-five bonds of the denomination of one thousand dollars each, bearing interest at the rate of four per cent per annum, interest payable semi-annually, April 1st and October 1st, of each year, at the office of the treasurer of said borough, be issued. Said bonds to be numbered from one to twenty-five, inclusive, and bond No. 1, of said issue be made payable on the 1st day of October, 1911, and the rest of said bonds be payable, one each year on October 1st, in the order of their number until all are paid. And that the proceeds derived from the sale of said bonds be used for the purpose of paying off or redeeming the thousand dollars of the present indebtedness of said Borough, and so much of the balance as may be necessary, shall be used for the purpose of constructing the trunk line of a sewer for the sewer system authorized to be constructed by said Borough.

Sec. 2. That a tax of one mill on the dollar of the assessed valuation of the taxable property of said Borough, be and the same is hereby levied each and every year, commencing in 1907, for the payment of said indebtedness and interest, until the same are paid.

Sec. 3. That the attorneys of said Borough shall prepare a suitable form for the bonds hereby (and in accordance with the Acts of Assembly relating thereto) authorized to be issued and submit the same to the Finance Committee of the Borough Council, for approval, and when the same shall be approved by said committee, the said committee shall have the same engraved and prepared, and an order shall be drawn on the treasurer of said Borough, to pay the expenses thereof.

Sec. 4. That the Burgess of the said Borough of Sayre, is hereby authorized and empowered to sign the said bonds and coupons attached thereto, the same to be countersigned by the Secretary of the said Borough Council, who shall affix the corporate seal of said Borough thereto.

Sec. 5. That the Finance Committee of the said Borough Council, is hereby authorized and empowered to advertise for bids for the sale of said bonds and also to sell the same to the highest bidder or bidders, at a price not less than the par value thereof.

Sec. 6. That all bonds issued by virtue of this ordinance and the Acts of Assembly authorizing the same shall be and become a part of the funded debt of the said Borough of Sayre, and for the payment of the principal of the said bonds, and the semi-annual interest accruing thereon, the faith, honor and credit of said Borough of Sayre, are hereby pledged.

Sec. 7. That ordinance No. 95, passed July 2, 1906, entitled "An Ordinance authorizing the increase of the indebtedness of the Borough of Sayre, Pa.," be and the same is hereby repealed.

The foregoing Ordinance was unanimously adopted by the Sayre Borough Council at a regular meeting held Monday evening, August 6, 1906.
