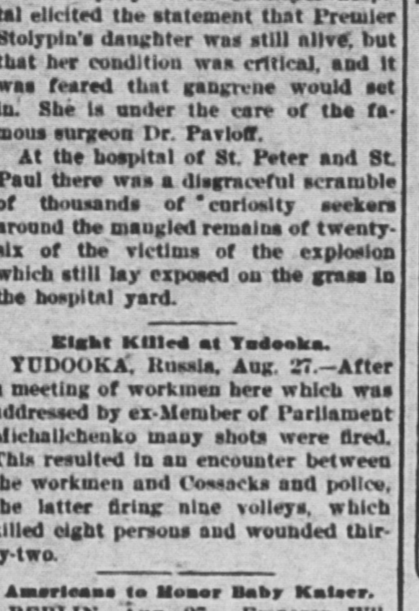
Whether the assassins who entered the crowded reception hall threw the bomb or accidentally dropped it probably never will be known, as all the immediate eyewitnesses were killed.
