SQUADRON IN REVIEW

President Roosevelt Heads Grand Naval Pageant.

POWERFUL FLEET SALUTES HIM.

Admiral Evans in Command of the Greatest Assembly of Warships and Destroyers Ever Gathered Under Our Flag.

OYSTER BAY, N. Y., Sept. 3.—Since the time when Commodore Barry, "Father of the American navy," dreamed that some day the United States would be a great sea power there never has been a naval pageant on the western continent which could equal that which was seen at Oyster Bay, where the squadrons were reviewed by President Roosevelt.

The fleet was in full dress at 8 o'clock in the morning. At 11 o'clock the president reviewed the whole fleet from the Mayflower, steaming to the head of the first squadron and then along to the south side of that squadron, between it and the torpedo craft.

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President Roosevelt was saluted when the Mayflower came within signal distance of the leading ship, and the other vessels followed the flagship in the salute.

After the Mayflower had anchored the flag officers and division commanders paid their respects to the president, followed by the commanding officers. The latter had been invited by the president to take luncheon with him on the Mayflower.

Never since the day that Columbus landed in America has there been such a simultaneous discharge of artillery as honored the president.

A fine spectacle in itself was the excursion fleet which carried tens of thousands of spectators from New York. It is estimated that there were 150 craft of various sorts on the side lines and that, counting the throngs that lined the shores, nearly half a million people witnessed the review.

BRIDGEPORT, Conn., Sept. 3.—Miss Annie Hogan, a maid employed at the summer residence in Black Rock of Mr. and Mrs. Clinton of New York, 11 she lives, will owe her life to Commander Alexander Neboisne, naval attaché of the Russian embassy at Washington, who is a member of the summer colony at Black Rock.

Yacht Races Start. MARBLEHEAD, Mass., Sept. 3.—The German-American races for the Roosevelt cup off the coast, under the joint control of the Kaiserlicher Yacht club of Kiel and the Eastern Yacht club of Boston, were started off Halfway Rock at 11 o'clock a. m. this morning.

Norwegian Captain Rewarded. PORTSMOUTH, Va., Sept. 3.—Congressman H. L. Maynard has just been notified that the United States government has delivered to Captain C. Anderson, master of the Norwegian steamship Tanager, a magnificent marine glass in recognition of his heroism in rescuing the crew of the American schooner Wallace Gray in midocean.

Richly Rewarding. SARATOGA, N. Y., Sept. 3.—Henry M. Lovington, a wealthy resident of this place for forty years and widely known by his many acts of benevolence, is dead here, aged eighty-five years. He was a native of Boston.

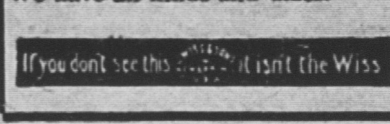
