The decision refusing ohnson another chance for his life was handed down immediately after court opened in the afternoon. they will spend a few days sight Lilley & Wilson, attorneys for the condemned man, it is said, will appeal-from the decision of Judge Fanning and take the case to the supreme court. An appeal to the supreme court of course will act as a stay of execution.

Immediately after the opinion of the court was handed down District Attorney Mills moved that the prisoner be sentenced, Johnson was brought into court a few minutes later. The long confidement in jail has bleached his complexion, and he does not look much as he did when first arraigned on the charge of murdering Maggie Johnson and little Annie Benjamin. Recently he has undergone considerable change. Persons visiting the jail do not now get an opportunity to look him in the face. On the approach of visitors he turns his head and appears deeply engrossed in a newspaper or book until the unwelcome guest departs.

In court yesterday Johnson kept his eyes continually on the judge. and when asked whether he had anything to say why sentence of death should not be pronounced he declared in a loud, clear voice, "I am innocent of this crime."

Johnson has been tried twice for the part he played in the murder, and there are many who think that no further effort should be made to reverse a judgment which


