ANNUAL REUNION

Athens—The annual reunion of the survivors of the Sixth Pennsylvania Reserves at Smithfield today was of special interest to many of the residents in this vicinity. The first soldiers enlisted for the war, from Athens, were assigned to Company F of this regiment, and was composed of some of the best young men of the place. Captain Daniel Bradbury was working in Blood & Co's agricultural manufacturing works, and he dropped his tools when the news came of the firing on Fort Sumpter, and at once engaged in the work of enlisting men for his company. A part of the company were enlisted in Smithfield. Laron W. Forrest, Diton Phelps and John W. Schouster were of this number. W. Augustus Meeker of Athens, was made second lieutenant, and he rose from that position to be major by brevet, and was so severely wounded at the Wilderness as to be reported among the dead. But he lived to return and died in Philadelphia ten years after the war closed. Of the Athens soldiers serving in the regiment Marshall O Hicks, Patrick Burk, Thomas Barnes, Aaron A. Daily, William Foran, W. Z. Gordon, Myron Lowe were killed in battle.

As this regiment went out so early in the conflict before we had become familiar with the terrible casualties of war, its career was watched with increasing interest and anxiety by the friends at home.
