THANKS HIS ENEMIES W. R. Hearst Draws Campaign Lines at New York.

ADDRESSSES FIVE MASS MEETINGS. Democratic and Independence League Candidate For Governor Has Hot Words For Opponent—Scores Parker and Jerome.

NEW YORK, Oct. 2.—Congressman William R. Hearst, the candidate of the Democratic party and the Independence League for governor, last night paid a flying visit to Brooklyn, where he addressed five mass meetings in half an hour.

"The Independence League was created for the purpose of freeing the government from the corrupt and contaminating control of corporations and liberating the people from such unequal and un-American conditions."

"The corporation forces are now united behind the corporation attorney of the corporation party, and the line I have so long labored to have clearly drawn is clearly drawn at last."

"I wish publicly to thank Judge Parker for his opposition to me. William F. POLICY KING KILLS HIMSELF. At Adams' Death Fit End to His Ill Spent Life.

NEW YORK, Oct. 2.—Al Adams, the policy king whom the late Norton Goddard sent to Sing Sing, committed suicide in his apartments at the Ansonia.

Adams was found lying on the floor of his bedroom. He had fired the shot standing in front of a mirror and had fallen backward over a chair near his desk.

It was in vain that attacks were made upon this organized system of plunder. The police would occasionally arrest runners and dealers, but never would touch Adams and his aids.

It was not until the late Captain Norton Goddard became interested in settlement work on the east side that Adams' policy game was ended.

FLEET OF AIRSHIPS England Invaded by Aerial Navigators From France.

AMERICAN OFFICER LEADS THE WAY Lieutenant Frank P. Lahm, Sixth Cavalry, U. S. A., Wins First Prize in Great Balloon Race From Paris to Britain.

PARIS, Oct. 2.—A sensational announcement of the result of the great airship race for the James Gordon Bennett cup for international aeronauts has been given out as follows:

WINS CUBAN HEARTS Governor Taft Declares His Mission at Havana.

HAVANA, Oct. 2.—Governor Taft's actions since American intervention in Cuba have gone far to win him a warm place in the hearts of the people whose destinies have been placed in his hands.

Following this it became known that Governor Taft and Assistant Secretary of State Bacon had cabled for their wives to join them here, a step which cannot be met with complete approval by the Cuban people.

These evidences of American good will have earned such general favorable comment that the landing of the battalion of marines, 1,000 strong, which will constitute the garrison here, caused hardly a ripple of excitement.

There now seems little likelihood of a second army expedition being sent to Cuba. The good grace with which both factions in Cuba seem to accept American intervention has made unnecessary, for the present at least, the sending of a large army of occupation to the island.

ST. ANDREW'S BAY, Fla., Oct. 2.—The storm here was terrific, the tide rising six feet higher than it has in fifty years before, the only storm of equal violence here being in 1856.
