Engine Turned Completely Over and Eighteen Cars Were Derailed

An expensive freight wreck occurred on the Lehigh Valley at Flemington Junction last night at 5 o'clock, in which the engine was turned completely over and 18 freight cars piled into a mass of broken wood and twisted iron. Details as to the cause of the wreck are meagre. The accident occurred at the junction of the Lehigh and Reading. An eastbound freight train, moving at a speed of 20 miles an hour, ran into a string of cars. The engine toppled over an embankment and was badly damaged. The fireman and engineer escaped unhurt. Passenger train No. 3, which was due about the time the accident occurred, narrowly escaped running into the wreckage.
