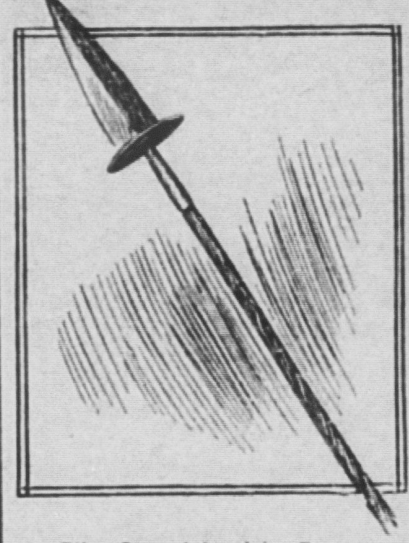

MRS. EDDY ALIVE AND WELL. Christian Science Leader Not Admitted With Cancer, as Reported. CONCORD, N. H., Oct. 30--Christian Scientists in this center of their faith were greatly excited by the publication in New York of a story that the seclusion maintained by Mrs. Mary Baker G. Eddy for more than three years was designed to hide the ravages of cancer and that she was being personated on her supposed daily drives by Mrs. Pamela J. Leonard of Brooklyn to conceal her condition. Denials came from all sides.

RAISULI AS GOVERNOR. Bandit Chief, Holding Arzilia, Proposes to Collect Revenues. TANGIER, Morocco, Oct. 30--Taking advantage of the absence of Raisuli, the bandit chief, at Arzilia, the Aujeris, a tribe hostile to him, have raided his stronghold at Zinat, carrying off his cattle after a two hours' fight. Raisuli has proclaimed himself governor of Arzilia, where order has been practically restored.

Politics in Forger Arrest Hinted. BOSTON, Oct. 30--A plea of not guilty was entered by William J. Day, a lawyer, when he was arraigned in the superior court on the charge of forgery. Day is alleged to have forged the endorsement of the clerk of the United States district court on a check for \$30 drawn by the cashier of the Arlington National bank of Lawrence. Mr. Day was made the subject of a campaign speech, when United States District Attorney Asa P. French charged that he had called the matter to the attention of Assistant District Attorney Moran last April. He said he had been unable to get a satisfactory response in regard to the forgery. Two hours before Mr. French delivered his speech at Beverly, Day was placed under arrest on an indictment which, according to Day, was found against him last July.
