**OLD RESIDENT  
DIED YESTERDAY**

Charles D. Mills Passes Away  
After Eight Months Illness

Waverly—Charles L. Mills, a well known and life-long resident of this village died at 12:30 o'clock yesterday afternoon at his home on Chemung street. His death was due to cancer from which he had suffered for the past eight months.

He was 64 years of age and had been a resident of this section all his life, having been born at Talmadge Hill and moving into what is now the village of Waverly at an early age. He was a prominent member of the Waverly Methodist church, and had always been active in the work of the church. He had been treasurer of the Sunday School for 39 years, and at the time of his death was president of the board of trustees.

He had always been a man of robust constitution until about eight months ago when he was attacked by cancer. An operation in a New York hospital failed to stop its growth, and he gradually grew worse until the time of his death.

His wife died only eight weeks ago. He is survived by three children, Mrs. J. M. Green, and Miss Harriet Mills of Waverly, and Daniel B. Mills of Theresa, N. Y. Three sisters and three brothers also survive.

The funeral will take place from the house tomorrow, Saturday afternoon at 3 o'clock. The Rev. H. B. Cook will conduct the service, and the remains will be buried in Forest Home cemetery.

**MAN ASSAULTED  
WIFE'S COMPANION**

Banged Him Hard and Temporarily Deprived Him of Facial Beauty

Waverly—There is a man in Waverly who has a wife who some times prefers the company of other men. Last night she was traveling around the village in company with one of her friends when her husband espied them together. 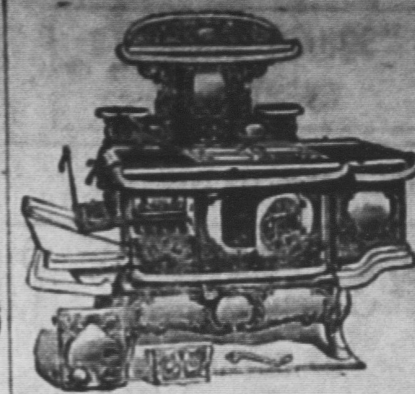
