The interment will be at the Home cemetery.

POLICE CAPTURE BAD CHARACTER

Robbed Countryman and Then Fled to Elmira; Caught and Brought to Waverly

Waverly--Yesterday afternoon Officer Charles Gridley went to Elmira after John Romano, an Italian who was arrested in that place by the Italian officer on information furnished from this place. He returned on Erie train No. 24, and Romano was at once arraigned before Justice Hoagland on the charge of robbery in the second degree. The complaint was sworn to by Pietro Curioso, who alleged that on the 19th day of November at 10 o'clock at night, on Pine street, Romano had forcibly thrown him down and robbed him of a purse containing \$45. One of his countrymen also made affidavit to having witnessed the robbing and said that Romano immediately ran away. About 12 o'clock that night several Italians congregated on Loder street and a riot would have ensued had it not been for the timely arrival of the police. A dangerous looking knife was picked up after the scarp and the police have it in their possession. Romano was said to have been mixed up in the trouble and the police have been looking for him since. He will be given an examination at 4 o'clock this afternoon.
