His commitment was in the hands of Spencer Brougham when Heeman escaped. Now the latter will be compelled to answer a charge of jail breaking, Constable Brougham having been armed with a warrant charging this offense when he went to Towanda this morning,

Constable Brougham brought Heeman here today on No. 157 He was taken before Justice Carey and arraigned on the charge of jail breaking. At the examination Heeman admitted having broken from the lockup and said the job was "dead easy." He was held to court in the sum of \$200 bail, and this afternoon Constable Brougham took him to Towanda. The officer had two commitments in his pocket. One for jail breaking and the other for larceny. Heeman is also under indictment for several other offenses and when he faces the court he has promised to plead guilty to
