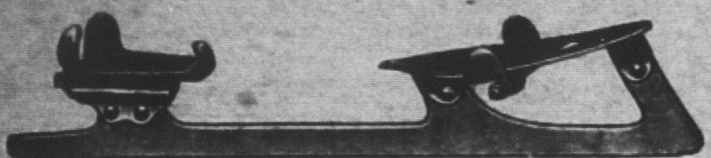

BOX RENT MUST BE PAID IN ADVANCE.

Postoffice Department Has Promulgated a New Rule With Reference to Lock Boxes.

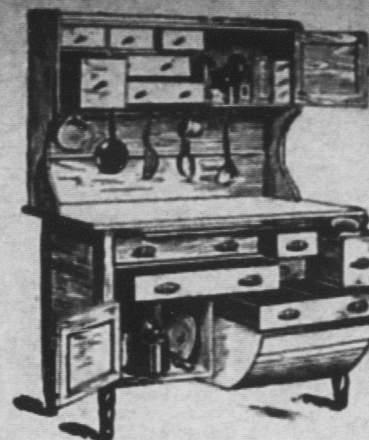

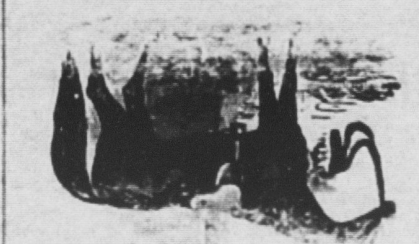
