Resumes Medical Practice.

ARCHBISHOP EXPELLED.

Cardinal Richard Vacates Episcopal Palace at Paris.

PARIS, Dec. 18.—Cardinal Richard, archbishop of Paris, voluntarily vacated the episcopal palace and temporarily accepted the hospitality of Denys Cochin, the Conservative deputy, at the latter's residence in the Rue de Babylone. The departure of the primate was the occasion for an imposing Catholic manifestation on the part of the majority of the bishops and priests of Paris, many members of the nobility and about 3,000 men, women and children. The gathering completely blocked the street in front of the episcopal palace, and those present sang "The Credo" and other canticles as the cardinal was assisted into his carriage by the coadjutor archbishop, Mgr. Amette, and his two vicars general. The crowd knelt and chanted as the cardinal seated himself in the vehicle, and the venerable prelate, who was much moved, then stood up and blessed the multitude.

A number of young Catholics thereupon approached the carriage, detached the horses and with difficulty dragged it through the dense masses of people lining the streets. On all sides were heard cries of "Long live Plus X!" and "Long live the cardinal!" About three-quarters of an hour was consumed in pulling the carriage from the palace to the residence of Denys Cochin, a distance of about a mile, and doubtless a longer time would have been consumed had it not been for the fact that detachments of mounted Republican guards preceded and followed the procession in order to prevent any possible disorder. But there was not the slightest attempt on the part of the nonreligious crowds to make any counter manifestation.

Wage Increase For 30,000.

BOSTON, Dec. 18.—Cotton mill operatives numbering about 30,000 employed in different sections of New England have received an advance in wages or a promise of advance at an early date. In Lowell about 17,000 operatives received an increase of 5 per cent. About 1,000 hands employed by the Dwight Manufacturing company at Chicopee received an advance, the amount of which was not announced. The Arlington mills in Lawrence have announced an increase of 7 1/2 per cent in the wages of its 6,000 employees. The increase is to become effective on Dec. 24.

CAPTAIN SHOT HIMSELF.

Hamburg Lise, Toria's Wife Dies.

KINGSTON, Jan. 10, Dec. 18.—The Hamburg American Toria's wife, Princess Victoria Louise, from New York Dec. 12 for this port, went ashore during the night of Port Royal while on her way back to New York.

The passengers on board were landed here safely.

Captain Bruinwig, who was in charge of the Victoria Louise when she struck, committed suicide by blowing out his brains in his cabin.

In accounting for the stranding of the steamer it is explained that she was without a pilot and the captain in charge. He followed a wrong course and piled her up on the rocks just under the lighthouse. Two hours later the captain locked himself in his cabin and blew out his brains. The officers of the ship and the German consul here made ineffectual efforts to hush up the news of the tragedy.

The German cruiser Bremen has gone to the assistance of the stranded steamer, and the French training ship Duguay-Trouin is preparing to leave port with the same object in view.

The Victoria Louise is pounding heavily, and the seas are breaking over her, but hopes are still entertained that she will be saved. She is resting on a rocky ledge.

According to the latest reports from the scene of the wreck the Bremen was trying to pull the stranded vessel off.

The body of Captain Bruinwig is still on board the Victoria Louise.

The Prinzessin Victoria Louise was launched at Hamburg in 1900 and was christened by the Countess von Waldsee, wife of the famous field marshal, Count von Waldsee of the German army, who was Miss Mary Esther Lee of New York city.

She was designed and built as a cruising yacht. All of her appointments are after the most approved modern plans, and she has on board many innovations, several of which were suggested by Emperor William. She has been utilized in the excursion business entirely. She carried first class passengers only, limited in number, and never carried mails or cargo. She has been used extensively by the Hamburg line to convey tourists through the West Indies.

France Had Many Wives.

NEW LONDON, Conn., Dec. 18.—Probable cause was found in the case of the state against John France, alias John Francis Harkins, charged with bigamy by Miss Sarah L. Gilder of Brighton, Mass., who says that she is the third living wife of France and that the latter never obtained a divorce. He was remanded to the county jail. Miss Gilder was married to France in this city Aug. 31, 1901. He was married to Mary Ann McLaughlin of Providence in that city on March 18, 1901. In the spring of 1902 the latter obtained a divorce in the Rhode Island courts. France is said to have two more wives living.
