Valley Throttle Men Will Benefit Con viderably-All Classes Benefit Under Recently Established Schedule, Some More Than Others.

Several important changes have een made on the Lehigh Valley Railroad relative to the working hours and rates of wages of the engineers. According to the new book of rules ssued by the company and distributed among the employes there are a number of new rules and this class of workmen will be benefitted. The new schedule reads that all engineers on the yard and mine runs will be given a ten hour day with the same

It is understood that this class orkmen must not utilize a part of the ten for meals. They must rest Christmas day, between 12 and 1 o'clock, either in the day or at night. Overtime will be allowed after 10 hours and 30 minutes. Whenever engine men are compelled to work during the lunch hour one-tenth of a day's pay will be allowed.

Other Changes Made . Euglne men who work five hours or less shall receive one-half day's pay and all who work more than 5 hours and 30 minutes will be given a day's pay.
