Engineer a Considerable Amount Can Be Saved by Altering

The bornogh council was to have held a meeting last night but as a quorum failed to show up the meeting was adjourned until rext week. ing Borough Engineer Walker, and although there was no regular meeting the sewer project was discussed by those who were present. Engineer Walker unfolded a plan which by changing the present route of the proposed sewer will save the borough n the neighborhood of \$400.

According to the present plans the sewer will pass under the Lehigh tracks at a point below Hayden avenue. Thence up Lehigh avenue to Hayden, over Hayden to Desmond street, along Desmond street to Lehigh avenue, and thence up the latter thoroughfare to the trolley bridge. Mr. Walkmer avenue, thence along Elmer avenne to Lockhart street, which will save about 360 feet of pipe. While it will it is claimed that the difference in the amount of pipe to be furnished will cause a saving of nearly \$400 The propose change in the route will probably come up at the next meeting of the council.
