TRAINS LOOTED ON THE VALLEY ROAD

Freight Taken From Cars in Transit.

Cars of merchandise have been looted between Wilkes-Barre and Sayre, and despite the activity of the Lehigh Valley officials and detectives the guilty parties have not been located.

The local authorities are satisfied that the looting is being done on the Sayre division, but just where is a conundrum, for despite the number of watchmen employed, very frequently seals are broken and the cars entered and goods taken.

It is judged from the acts of perpetrators that a system is being employed. It appears that the thieves lay in hiding for a train and just as a stop is made they break open the seals and take the articles that are the easiest to carry.

This condition of affairs leaked out yesterday when a special officer followed one of the accused to Wilkes-Barre, and while he did not arrest him, yet felt satisfied that he is one of the guilty parties and he will be held under surveillance for the next few days.
