Blish, F. Dawson, H. S. Fish and A. L. Laws, et al, under the Act of Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania entitled, "An Act regulating the organization and incorporation of secret, fraternal, beneficial societies, orders or associations and protecting the rights of members therein," approved April 6th, 1892, and its supplements, for the Charter of an intended corporation to be called "THE UNITED PROTECTIVE ASSOCIATION," the character and object of which is the formation of a secret, fraternal, beneficial society to provide for the payment to its members of sick, disability or death claims in such amounts as may be authorized, and to provide for the payment of money upon the expiration of a fixed period of not less than five years to members whose beneficiary or distribution period may then expire of such sum not exceeding the maximum amount named in the beneficiary certificate as the Constitution and general laws in force at the expiration of said period may authorize and direct as shown by the proposed charter now on file in the Office of the Prothonotary of Bradford County, at Towanda, Pa.; and for this purpose to have, possess and enjoy all the rights, benefits and privileges conferred by said act of assembly and the laws of this Commonwealth.
