In North Dakota, where the thermometer has run down forty degrees below zero they have had no coal and have been obliged to pack off their families to the school houses and public halls where the whole neighborhood could cluster around one fire and thus economize the fuel supply. We have lately seen a lady that came from there and she gives a thrilling description of conditions in that region. On some of the ranches hundreds of miles away from the towns women have lived in solitude and when the coal famine reached the vicinity they could not get any and have frozen to death right in their homes. When she came east she says that there were 21 dead bodies on the train that she strated on. These were all persons that had frozen to death at their own firesides.
