Panic at Chatham Square When Part of Structure Fell. NEW YORK Feb. 23.—With a crash that startled everybody in the vicinity of Chatham square the forward trucks of an elevated railroad car thundered down to the street, carrying with them a ton of the structure, narrowly missing a crowded surface car that had just passed and causing a panic that resulted in calling out the police reserves, four fire engines and four ambulances and in the arrest of Frank Purcell, the tower man, who is charged with carelessness in turning the switch too soon. Overhead could be seen the long body of the car hanging crosswise over the rails and threatening to topple to the ground, while passengers, with blood stained faces and screaming hysterically, were feeling from the car. When the police finally got the crowd under control—and thousands had apparently sprung from the earth like magic at the first note of danger—they found there was no danger of the car falling and that, while a number of persons had been cut by flying glass and were suffering from shock, not a life was lost and no one was hurt so seriously as to necessitate removal to the hospital. It was a remarkable escape from a catastrophe entailing the loss of many lives. The accident was due to the derailing of a car on a Third Avenue train bound for South Ferry. The train had just pulled out of Chatham square station, and six of the cars had cleared the switch. The forward trucks of the seventh and last car also cleared the switch, but the rear trucks did not. The car was thus jerked off the rails. It skidded along to the angle of the tracks where the shanty used as a tool house is located and knocked down the shanty, the wreck falling into the street. The heavy forward trucks of the car crashed through the supports of the platform and fell to the street. The car itself ground along the platform for fifty feet before it finally came to a stop and hung suspended across the track. The frightened passengers, most of whom had been cut by glass, rushed out upon the structure, and all managed to reach a place of safety, but a sand was in full swing before the police reached the scene.
