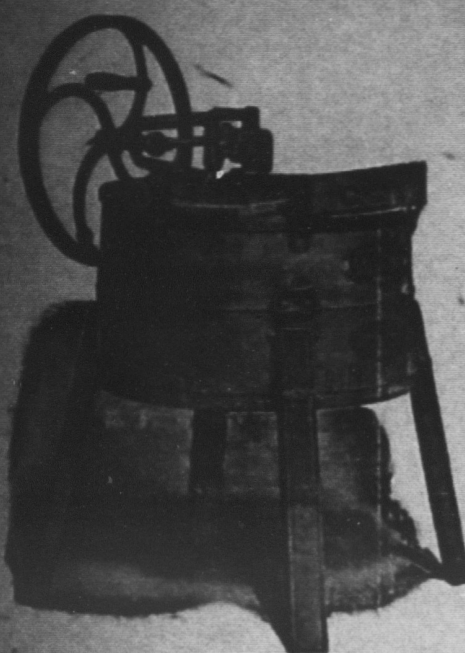

SPRING WEATHER RECEIVES SET-BACK
