A Family Ice Machine

A process has already been discovered by which every family can. facture sufficient ice for its own use ply of daily in a few minutes' time. The process necessitates the use of a cylinder that is capable of holding a pressure of 1,200 pounds of compressed air to the square inch, but with the use of 700 pounds the temperature of a certain volume of water can be reduced to 30 degrees below zero in half a minute. The machine will cost but a few dollars.


