WASHINGTON, Feb. 6, 1892. Honorable J. S. Clarkson, Chair. man of the Republican National Committee.

MY DEAR SIR :--

I am not a candidate for the Presidency, and my name will not go before the Republican National Convention for the nomination. I make this announcement in due season.

To those who have tendered me their support I owe sincer thanks, and am most grateful for their confidence. They will, I am sure, make earnest effort in the approaching contest, which is rendered specially important by reason of the industrial and financial policies of the Government being at stake. The popular decision on these issues is of great moment, and will be of farreaching consequences.
