**THE BOARD OF PARDONS.**

Several Murder Cases, Including That of Cleary, Held Under Advisement. Painton's Case Put Over.

HARRISBURG, April 26.—The Board of Pardons to-day recommended pardons in the following cases: Clark M. Eggleston, conspiracy, and Joseph Reilly, larceny and aggravated assault and battery, both of Allegheny county, and Frank A. Shaff, seduction, Clearfield. A rehearing was granted to Edward McMillan, of Luzerne, under sentence of death. Pardon recommendations were refused in the following cases: Charles Hannon, murder in the second degree, Allegheny; James Lester, burglary, Venango; David Burns, rape, and James Burns, accessory after the fact on rape, Philadelphia; Charles Hewitt, murder in the second degree, Richard Banningan, burglary, Lehigh; E. P. Wilkinson, murder in the second degree, Luzerne. The murder cases of Patrick Fitzpatrick, of Allegheny; Martin Reed of Washington, and Charles Cleary, of Clinton, were held under advisement. The case of William H. Painton, of York, was continued until the May meeting.
