A charter was issued last week for the largest electric railroad in the state, the Northumberland, Bloomsburg and Scranton street railway company, with main office at Hazleton. The capital is \$500,000, and the line runs from Northumberland through Cameron and Chulaski to Danville, thence to Mechanicsville, Ridgeville, Catawissa Junction, Catawissa, Rupert, Bloomsburg, Espy, Lime Ridge, Willow Grove, Brier Creek, Berwick, across the Susquehanna to Nescopeck, back to Berwick, thence to Beach Haven, Hicks Ferry Shick-shinny, Hunlock's Creek, West Nanticoke, Nanticoke, returning to West Nanticoke, thence to Avondale, Plymouth, Kingston, Bennett, Maity, Wyoming, West Pittston, Pittston, Durva, Lackawanna, Taylorville, Bellevue, ending at Scranton, returning to Northumberland by same route.
