WILL GO TO NEW ORLEANS.

NEW YORK, Nov. 6.—But two things now stand in the way of a contest for the heavy weight championship of the world between Mitchell and Corbett.

Owing to their being no assurance that the fight could be pulled off successfully there, but very little attention was paid at first to those articles. Since that time, however, assurances have been repeatedly forwarded to this city that there would be no difficulty about the match taking place.

The negotiations that have been in progress were brought to a head tonight near this city. For obvious reasons the place of meeting of those interested is kept a secret.

It was decided to reject the original agreement mailed here by the Olympic Club and a new one was

drawn up. This provides for a purse of \$20,000, the winner to take all. The fight to take place about December 18th.

The principals stipulate that the fight must be to a finish or until such time as the referee considers the contest brutal and inhuman, when he has the power to stop it and declare the man having the better of it the winner.

STATE GAME LAW.

Syllabus of the Same for the Benefit of Sportsmen Generally.

The following are the game laws of this state with reference to hunting, as compiled by Forest and Stream:

Elk, Deer, Antelope, Venison—Act of June 3, 1878—Sec. 1. That no person shall kill in any part of this state any elk or wild deer, save only from the first day of October in any year to the 15th day of December next following.

Squirrels—Sec. 2. No person shall kill any gray, black, or fox squirrel between the first day of January and the 1st day of Sept. Hare Rabbit—Sec. 3. No person shall kill any hare, commonly called rabbit, between the 1st day of January and the 1st day of November.

Woodcock—Sec. 8. No person shall kill any woodcock between the first day of January and the 4th day of July. Quail, Virginia Partridge—Sec. 9. No person shall kill any quail or Virginia partridge between the 15th day of December in any year and the 1st day of November next following.

Ruffed Grouse, Pheasant, Partridge—Sec. 10. No person shall kill any ruffed grouse, commonly called pheasants, or pinnated grouse commonly called prairie chicken, between the 1st day of January and the 1st day of October.
