

Notice is hereby given that every person excepting Justice of the Peace who shall hold an office or appointment of profit or trust under the United States or this State or city or incorporated district whether a commissioner of the United States or of any city, or of any incorporated district, and also that every member of Congress and of the State Legislature, and of the select and common council of any city, or commissioners of any incorporated district, is by law incapable of holding or exercising at the same time the office or appointment of judge, inspector or clerk of any election of this Commonweath, and that no inspector, judge or other officer of any such election in the district to which they respectively belong tors and Judges of the elections shall meet at the respective places appoint of the holding the election in the district of such district.
