THE REPUBLICAN COUNTY CONVENTION.

Saturday, February 29

The Republican Standing Committee met in Laporte on Tuesday, January 28, 1896, when it was voted that the Republican County Convention be held in Laporte.

Saturday, February 29, 1896, at 1 o'clock p. m. to elect one delegate to the National Convention (subject to District conference), one delegate to the State Convention, choose congressional centers, who shall in the event of their being a home candidate for Congress, support his candidacy in the District conference, and to transact any other business that may be brought before the convention pertaining to the Republican party.

Debate election will be held on Saturday, February 22, 1896 between the hours of 4 and 7 p. m.
