Court Proceedings.

The second week of the regular September term of courts (civil list) convened at the Court House, Laporte, on Monday, September 26, '98, at 2 p.m. Hon. E. M. Dunham, President, and the Hons. John S. Line and Conrad Kraus, Associates, on the Bench.

The list of traverse jurors called. The trial list was then called over and disposed of as follows:

Mitchell; Young & Co. vs A. J. Hackley; certified case. Continued. James McFarlane vs W. C. Mason; certified case. Continued.

A. C. Haverly vs Benj. Kuykendall. Continued by agreement of parties; ordered at the head of list for December term.

Merritt Shaffer vs Josephine Fitzpatrick; Feigned Issue. Jury called. After case had been opened, the Court ordered a jury withdrawn, and certified this case for trial to another Judge.

A. L. Smith vs Robert McEwen. Case settled by agreement filed.

Durwood Saddlemeier vs Lopez Mfg. Co. Jury called and case on trial. After plaintiff had closed their case, defendant's counsel moved for a compulsory non suit, which after argument, was granted, with leave to the plaintiff to move the Court *in banc* to take off the same.

Martin Merce vs E. V. Ingham; certified, continued.

F. M. Lewis vs J. W. Ballard; certified, continued.

James McFarlane vs Josiah Hembury Deft., and Henry McGibbens and John G. Scouten *Terre Tenants*. Jury called, case tried. By direction of the Court jury find as follows: "Non suit as to *Terre Tenants* and judgment against Josiah Hembury for \$214.91.

Viola Jennings vs Geo. H. Moore. Settled by agreement of parties on terms filed.

Russel Karns vs Harry Paulhamus. Jury called, case tried. Verdict for Plaintiff for \$49. This was an action brought to recover rent for a house at Lake Mokoma that plaintiff alleged the defendant rented from him on March 1, 1897, for one year.

F. A. Tomlinson vs Jacob A. Meyers and Wm. I. Taylor. Continued by agreement.

John W. Buck vs John and Wm. Stackhouse, Defts., and Rush J. Thomson and Geo. C. Jackson, Garnishees. The attachment in this case discriminated and withdrawn as to Rush J. Thomson by agreement.

In re: Estate of Edward Sharp, decd., rule for attachment, continued.

Emma M. Boyd vs Wm. H. Taylor and Lizzie F. Taylor. On hearing petition and on motion of counsel for Defts. a rule is granted on the Piff. to show cause why the writ of Sci Fas. issued in this case should not be quashed. Returnable Nov. 10 1898, at 1 o'clock p. m.

F. P. Vincent vs C. S. Mosier. Judgment in open court in favor of plaintiff, and against defendant for want of an appearance; amount to be ascertained by the Prothonotary. John W. Flynn vs C. E. Yorks. Judgment for plaintiff in open court for want of an appearance.

Dora B. Beitler vs Thos. Beitler, Sadie Swisher vs Frank Swisher, H. L. Lonsday vs Addlett Lonsday, decrees of divorce granted in each case.

Mary E. Wheeler vs Grant Wheeler in divorce. The Sheriff is directed to make publication in this case.

Mary B. Walburn vs Frank W. Walburn. Chas. Schock, J. P., appointed Com. to take testimony.

Ueta E. Berthalf vs Wm. J. Berthalf. An alias subpoena in divorce is directed to issue.

T. F. Rolason and H. E. Metcalf vs Anna G. Hill and B. F. Hill, her husband. Judgment is directed to be entered in favor of plaintiffs, for want of an appearance; amount to be ascertained by the Prothonotary.

J. D. Rhodes vs R. J. Mercur. Judgment in open court in favor of plaintiff for want of an appearance.

On petition of citizens the court appoint Julius Lusch, Herman Behr and E. S. Chase, viewers to view and lay out a public road from Big Bottom in Forks twp. to Cherry Mills in Cherry twp.

The report of viewers vacating a road in Shrewsbury twp. near M. Taylor's. Confirmed.

The W. & N. B. R. R. Co. vs W. E. King; report of viewers assessing damages. Confirmed.

The following matters were confirmed *in se* viz: Acct. of Emily E. Andrews, Admrx. of John H. Andrews deed.; Mary E. Kline, Admrx. of Patroclus Kline deed.; A. J. Bradley, Admr. of C. B. Miller deed.; A. L. Smith Garnishee of Emma C. Benfield; M. and L. H. Battin Exor. of Joseph Battin deed. Also the following widows appraisments: In the estates of Solon Haverly and Wm. W. Boyle. The above will be confirmed absolutely by the clerk of the Orphans' Court unless exceptions are filed thereto within ten days.

And the following were confirmed absolutely: Sale of real estate of Wm. F. Smith deed. and Elizabeth Shipman deed.

In re: Mortgage of real estate of Alfred Taylor deed. ordered continued until next term.

Jeremiah Deegan vs Hannah Farrell. All proceedings and matters returnable at this term, continued and made returnable Nov. 10, 1898.

Sherwood B. Davidge vs J. T. Forbes Deft. and the Farmers' and Mutual Home Fire Ins. Co. Garnishees. Judgment in open court against Garnishees for the sum of \$680.92 amount admitted to be in their hands; an Atty. fee of \$10 allowed counsel for Garnishees.

L. S. Burch & Co. vs Josiah Hembury Deft. and J. C. Robbins and J. G. Scouten: Judgment is directed to be entered against Josiah Hembury and J. G. Scouten for want of an affidavit of defence, unless a good and sufficient affidavit be filed within 5 days.

Davidson Twp. Overseers vs Muncy Creek Twp. Overseers. Additional bill of costs in this case is allowed to be filed.

Kate Quigley vs Ellis Swank. The Stenographer is directed to transcribe the notes of testimony and charge of the Court in this case and file same of record.
