INVESTIGATION FIZZLE.

The committee appointed to investigate allegations of bribery in connection with the McCarrell jury legislation and the senatorship has not made the sensations anticipated by the insurgents. The witnesses have reiterated the newspaper reports, which on the whole have been vague and indefinite and, while several have sworn they believed they might have gotten bribes, not a witness has been produced to show that any money was paid for a single vote. The insurgents were rather startled last week when one member of the house testified that right in the headquarters of the so-called Business Men's League a bold attempt was made to get him to remain out of the Republican senatorial caucus by an alleged offer of inducements by one of the Van Valkenburgs in the way of passing legislation in which he was informed that at these same headquarters of fake reformers, there was a discussion of the question of which of the supporters of the regular Republican caucus nominee would be apt to take money to have him change his vote from Colonel Quay. Testimony of this character has done much to discredit the whole investigation, which many regard as having been instituted soiely for political purposes. It is not likely to develop much since this end has not been accomplished. It is interesting to note that not a member of the legislature who has been voting for Senator Quay has been in any way involved in any improper action by the disclosures before the committee.

NEW YORK MARKETS

GRAIN—Wheat: Throughout the regular session the wheat market had a steady to strong undertone, being infinenced by a cold weather scare in winter and sping wheat States. The crowd was short after the previous days efforts and covered vigorously after the opening, the demand being supplemented by a fair inquiry from foreign houses and outside sources, so that last official prices of the day were 1@½c. net higher and the undertone quite firm. Local traders, however were disposed to overdo the matter on the advance, and curb trading brought out a heavy unloading movement, under which prices broke quite sharply. Aside from the weather news bull traders were not generously supplied with material on which to build up an advance, and sentiment was more unsettled than it has been for some time, fearing a general period of liquidation should a warm spell of weather developed in the Western section. No 2 red quoted 4c, over May and No. 1 Northern Duluth 7c, over saked, with no bids. On the curb May wheat was quoted from 78½c, to 76 ¾c., closing 77 3-16c, at 1 o'clock.

Corn: No. 2 corn was quoted 7c, over Chicago May for new, and 8c, over for old f. o. b. afloat.

Oats: There was very little trading in oats, and the market ruled nominally steady.

Rye: Market steady. No. 2 Western 65c., and No. 1 Western, 65½c, both f. o. b. afloat; State rye, 59c. c. 1, f. New York car lots.
