IN POLITICS TO STAY.

Futility of Placing Tariff Matters in the Hands of a Commission.

It is impossible by any human device to take the tariff out of politics without changing our government from republic to absolute monarchy. The tariff and all other business matters with which congress deals were put into politics when the foundations of the republic were laid, and they will stay there. The fact that the tariff affects all the people in their business and domestic affairs instead of being a reason why it should be taken out of politics is the very reason why it cannot be taken out.

It is as natural and inevitable that there should be varying and conflicting views as to tariff taxation as that different sects of Christians should disagree on creeds, and it would be no more impracticable to bring all the churches, sects and denominations together on a common creed by appointing a commission for that purpose than to get up tariff schedules satisfactory to all schools of political economists by the commission process.

In the first place, a nonpartisan commission that could agree upon a bill is manifestly absurd. A commission to amount to anything would have to be bipartisan. A Democratic tariff commission—one appointed by a Democratic president—would have an anti-protection or tariff for revenue only majority. A Republican president would see to it that a protection majority were appointed. But even if that impossibility were nonexistent and a strictly nonpartisan commission of tariff experts could agree upon a scheme, that agreement would not take it out of politics. "All bills for raising revenue must originate in the house of representatives." Both houses of congress must pass upon every item of a revenue bill. The report of a commission could not be anything more than suggestive to congress. The power to levy taxes cannot be delegated by congress to any board, body or commission which it could create.

Supposing the report of a commission to be presented to congress in the shape of a tariff bill, it is at once in politics, and in the most strenuous kind of politics. Not only the radical differences between parties have to be fought to a finish, but conflicting interests of industries and localities intensify the struggle. There is no encouragement in the precedent of the tariff commission that preceded the enactment of the tariff of 1883 to repeat that experiment. The senate framed that measure, cunningly dodging around a constitutional provision, and a marvelous ruling by Speaker Keifer sent it to a conference committee without giving the house a chance to consider it. And that tariff did not follow the lines laid down by the commission.

The country has had too many commissions of various kinds and too much money has been wasted in that way. It were far better for both the legislative and executive departments to do the work assigned to them by the constitution than to attempt to farm it out. And as our government is, and in its very nature must continue to be, a government by party, it must always be impossible to get national taxation out of politics.—Washington Post.

A Wrong Idea.

While the Democrats are talking that the combines whose products are protected by the United States tariff system should be cut out of such protection because they have outgrown the necessity for protection, it develops that such are not the facts. A conspicuous instance is that the rolling mills of Europe are called upon now to work at their full capacity to help the mills of this country to supply the demand for steel products. Other iron goods are also needed beyond the capacity of American plants. With the tariff kept at the protective point American plants will be enlarged to do all the work necessary for this country. With the tariff taken off, with Democratic free trade the European

mills would hold that trade and gain more as this country grew. American steel and iron workers would then come into direct competition with foreign labor, and wages would go down. The trust would not be crushed. The workers would be crushed. There is nothing plainer than that the Democratic idea is wrong from first to last.

Unfortunate.

It is unfortunate for the country and still more so for the Republican party that the debate in the senate on the Philippine bill has taken a partisan turn.—Philadelphia Ledger.

But not at all unfortunate that the Democrats have made it a partisan measure by denouncing the patriotism of our army and are berating Republicans for defending our loyal soldiers. However, the soldiers are mostly from the masses who work for a living, and if there is any one on the face of God's green earth despised and hated by Democratic free traders it is the American laborer. The Ledger is too good a paper to join, however slightly, with the foes of our soldiers merely because they are mostly breadwinners.

Nothing but Words.

The Republicans have to concede that there are never any strikes when the Democrats are in power. Under the rule of Democracy men are glad to work at any old price.—Alexandria Post-News.

In an old fashioned book there is a letter by St. James in which he refers to men who, when they find the unfortunate naked and destitute of daily food, say to them, "Depart in peace; be ye warmed, fed and clothed," but never furnish anything needful for the body. Even so Democratic free traders in 1892-96 addressed honeyed words to wage earners, but never lifted finger or voice to furnish employment. Yes, history does repeat itself and no mistake.

IN SHEEP'S CLOTHING.

But the Skin is Not Quite Big Enough to Hide the Free Trade Wolf.

Manufacturers, merchants, mill hands and wage earners generally understand the effect of an attack upon the protective tariff. The present generation had experience during the Democratic hard times which followed the election of Cleveland, and they have the history of similar hard times at several prior periods, the product of similar attacks.

It is useless to ask the victims of the Cleveland disaster to support any movement that could be identified as an attack upon the tariff; therefore our friends the enemy are trying to disguise their attack and have very nearly reached Republican ground in their effort to delude unwary voters into giving their support to Democratic congressmen.

If the people should be foolish enough to elect a Democratic majority to congress, a thing that seems impossible, they will find that the Democratic congressmen will speedily leave the safe ground occupied by Republicans and will launch out into impracticable

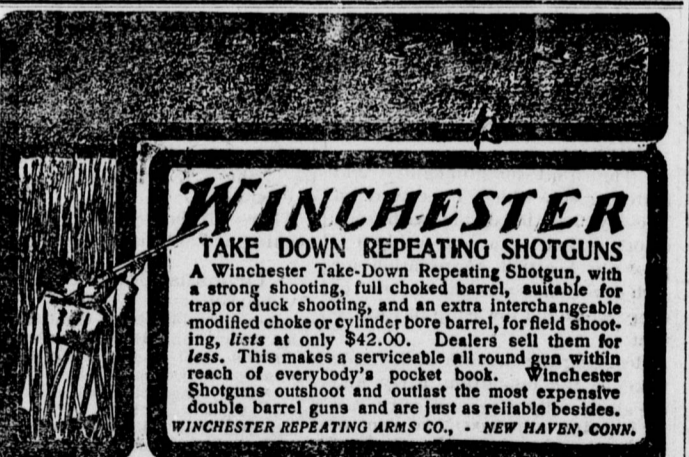
